Zip across the Bay of Naples on a hydrofoil to the isle of Capri for a delightful day exploring its winsome attractions. You will disembark at the Marina Grande Harbor, a magnificent setting that only hints at the island's affluence. For a glimpse into just how beautiful life can be on Capri, you will visit Villa San Michele, the extraordinary home that Swedish physician Axel Munthe built on a clifftop in the late 19th century. Now a museum surrounded by one of the most glorious gardens in Italy, the villa is even more revered for its sweeping views. After a light lunch, you will explore the town of Capri, starting in the Piazza Umberto I, known as the piazzetta. You will see an abundance of designer boutiques lining the sloping cobblestone streets off the little square as you make your way to Augustus Gardens. The name honors emperor Caesar Augustus, who fell in love with Capri while visiting in 29 BC.

Explore the carefully preserved ruins in Paestum, which the Greeks founded around 600 BC as the city of Poseidonia, and see many of its excavated artifacts in the archaeological museum. The remains of three of the world's finest ancient Greek temples still stand at Paestum. Two of them are dedicated to the goddess Hera, the other to Athena. Incredibly, the site was abandoned and forgotten for centuries after the nearby Silarus River silted up and created a malarial swamp. Excavations began in the 18th century and the wonders that have been unearthed present a fascinating glimpse into the world of the ancient Greeks and Romans. At the archaeological museum in Paestum, you will likely see a collection of terra cotta statues, decorative stone carvings of dancing women and war heroes, and a funerary painting of a man diving into water that may represent his transition into the afterworld.

- View the ruins of three Doric temples in Paestum that are among the finest in the world.
- Gain insight into how Paestum was founded and its demise after the nearby river silted up.
- Browse the enlightening artifacts in the archaeological museum in Paestum.

SAL-008 A WALK THROUGH NAPLES, SECRET TUNNELS & PIZZA

Stroll past landmarks and through tunnels before settling in for a lunch of pizza, a classic dish first created in Naples. Four Bourbon royal residences overlook the piazza, including pink-hued Palazzo Reale. During free time, you might browse the shops or simply relax while taking in the sights. Naples also features a stunning attraction below the surface—the Bourbon Tunnel. Begun in 1853 as an escape route for royalty, the cavernous tunnel was never finished and became part of an aqueduct system. As you will discover while in the depths of the tunnel, it was also used as an air raid shelter during World War II. Returning to the surface, you will stop for a lunch of Pizza Margherita. It is a fitting choice, as the dish was supposedly invented in Naples to honor the visiting Queen Margherita of Savoy.

- Walk through the delightful streets of Naples, passing landmarks such as Castle Nuovo.
- Spend free time shopping and exploring in the expansive square Piazza Plebiscito.
- Explore a series of 19th-century tunnels that were conceived as a royal escape route.

Expect to see ancient baths, residences with intricate mosaic floors and plaster casts of victims.

SAL-013 SALERNO WALK & CASTELLO ARECHI

Walk through the heart of Salerno, stopping at attractions that will afford you a historical and cultural perspective of the city. A former Roman colony, Salerno has seen its share of conquerors come and go, most of them leaving their mark. The 11th-century cathedral is particularly noteworthy as the relics of Saint Matthew and the tomb of Pope Gregory VII are inside. Still, no matter where you walk in Salerno, you can't miss the medieval Arechi Castle that looms forbiddingly over the city. While visiting the castle, you will learn a bit about its namesake, Lombard duke Arechi II, who strengthened the original fortress that stood there. Most of the items were found during excavations of the grounds. Arechi Castle is such a landmark that it was featured on an Italian postal stamp.

After pausing to watch artisans hand-carve classic cameos, your immersion into the ancient world will begin. Herculaneum was rediscovered by accident in the early 1700s when a well was dug there. Over the centuries, excavations have unearthed countless treasures that reflect the wealth of the residents. You can expect to view elaborate bath houses decorated with mosaics and frescoes, luxurious residences such as the House of the Black Salon and a food distribution center for the poor. In the somber House of Skeletons near the marina, volcanic gases and ash trapped more than 125 people. Scientists and anthropologists have learned much about the past residents' lives, diet and health by studying their bones.

- Realize the affluence of the ancient residents as you browse their luxurious homes.
- Discover what scientists have learned by studying the site and bones of the past residents.

The family-owned winery Casa di Baal will offer you a different insight into local life, as you tour the vineyards. The family practices natural vinification instead of using chemical fertilizers. It's a difference you can taste, as you will discover later in the wine cellar. The selection of wines may include a soft white made entirely with fiano grapes and a supple red made entirely with aglianco grapes. Fresh-baked bread and extra-virgin olive oil from the farm is typically served as an accompaniment. You may notice the symbol of an elephant around the farm; it's an homage to Hannibal, who used elephants in the Second Punic War.

- Tour a family-owned farm that produces wine and olive oil using organic methods.
- Sample several wines paired with fresh-baked bread, olive oil, meats and cheeses.
- Explore the atmospheric city center of Salerno during free time.
