Ride through Grenada's gorgeous interior in an open-air 4x4 vehicle, stopping on occasion for photos and to soak in the natural hot springs. The route will be immensely scenic, as you pass through verdant rainforest, charming villages and aromatic nutmeg plantations. Not far from Grenville on the eastern shore, you will take a leisurely walk through tropical woods to serene Claboney Sulphur Pond, which is typically waist deep. The nutrient-rich natural hot springs is said to be therapeutic, even to the point of having a positive effect on the aging process. Whether that's true or not, you can still expect to be wonderfully relaxed after a nice long soak. Then, returning to the 4x4 vehicle, you will continue driving to Grand Etang Crater Lake in the mountainous island interior. You may spot towering mahogany trees, bright splashes of flowers, and indigenous birds such as the broad-winged hawk, known locally as the gree-gree.



Grenada is also known for its premium rum, which you will taste at River Antoine Estate before dining at historical Belmont Estate. More memorable scenery awaits you at Carib's Leap, where dozens of indigenous Caribs jumped into the sea rather than surrender to the French in the mid-1600s. Continuing on, you will pass the island's largest fishing village, tour Dougaldston Spice Estate and finally see the bays where U.S. forces landed in 1983 during the invasion to protect American nationals from Grenada's Marxist regime, which was soon

It too is edged by native flora, especially hanging ferns and tropical flowers.




Delve into the history and production of some of Grenada's most characteristic products, including spices and herbs, followed by a tasting of the island's distinctive rum. Your first stop will be a family-owned business that manufactures nutmeg products. Expect to be surprised by the variety of merchandise made with this one signature ingredient, including jam, hot sauce and rum punch. You will become further immersed in spices at nearby Laura Spice Gardens. which grows common spices such as cinnamon and more unusual ones such as tonka beans, which are often substituted for vanilla in recipes. Continuing on to Westerhall Estate, you will learn how cocoa and sugarcane was processed in the late 1800s. Today, the attention has turned to rum, and you will have the opportunity to sample several of its finest. The estate's rums run the gamut from dark to light and vintage to white, usually served neat in a chilled shot glass.

- ·Visit a nutmeg manufacturer and marvel at the abundance of products made with the spice.
- ·Learn about unusual spices and herbs grown throughout Grenada, the Spice Island.
- Sample several premium rums made with local sugarcane at a distillery.

After approximately 75-minutes, you will return to the Sunset View Restaurant where you will have a chance to relax with a refreshing swim in the calm bay and a complimentary drink from the bar (rum punch, local beer, local fruit juice, soft drink or water).







KGN-001 VERMONT NATURE TRAIL HIKE

Hike through a protected rainforest with a guide that will point out exotic flora and fauna that may include the endangered St. Vincent Parrot, a species endemic to the island. Upon reaching the enormous St. Vincent Parrot Reserve, you will hike the Vermont Nature Trail, which winds through the lush rainforest. The scenery will be spectacular throughout the journey, but the real draw will be the chance to see the rare St. Vincent Parrot. Endangered because of loss of habitat and the illegal pet trade, this large parrot with multi-colored plumage is a favorite of birdwatchers. There is a good chance of seeing one or at least hearing its call. Similarly, the Whistling Warbler is another bird endemic to St. Vincent and often observed in the reserve. The boldly patterned, black-and-white warbler is usually seen happily flitting about the undergrowth. It too has a distinctive call that rises steadily in volume before ending emphatically.

·Sample freshly prepared conch that the guides have just plucked from the sea.

Meander down the lushly landscaped paths of two vastly different gardens: Kingstown's centuries-old botanical gardens and the more mountainous Montreal Gardens. Established in 1765, the botanical gardens are among the oldest in the Western Hemisphere. They contain colorful torch lilies, brain fruit palms, towering mahoganies and flowering Soufrieres, the national tree of St. Vincent, which isn't found anywhere else but on the island. A different sort of garden awaits you in the mountains above the fertile Mesopotamia Valley. A former plantation, Montreal Gardens is blessed with rich volcanic soil and a lovely terraced terrain. It is here that Welsh-born landscape designer Timothy Vaughn renovated 71/2 acres of land and turned it into a spectacular collection of gardens, each with its own design and personality. There is a formal garden, a color garden accented with splashes of brilliant flowers and a rainforest garden with a mountain stream that enhances its serenity.

- ·Pass a war memorial that honors the Vincentians that died in World War I.
- ·Stroll the winding paths of Kingstown's centuries-old botanical gardens.
- See a breadfruit tree descended from one donated by Captain Bligh of the HMS Bounty.
- ·Behold the exotic gardens that flourish in the volcanic soil of the Montreal Gardens.
- Dress in weather-appropriate clothing.
- ·Wear flat comfortable walking shoes.

They include a backdrop of verdant mountains, serene coves and gorgeous beaches. If you gaze toward the horizon, you may see humpback, pilot and sperm whales and pods of frolicking dolphins. In time, you will paddle past the Bat Cave, an opening in the volcanic shoreline that thousands of bats inhabit, and then arrive at Byahaut Cove. It is one of the best snorkeling spots on the island and typically not crowded, as it can only be reached by sea. You may recognize the cove from the movie "Pirates of the Caribbean," some of which was filmed there. As you will discover while snorkeling, the sights are just as extraordinary below the surface.



An oasis of serenity, the gardens contain countless species including rare ones such as a breadfruit tree that is the third generation of one donated by the infamous Captain Bligh of the HMS Bounty. Continuing on, you will venture through the Mesopotamia Valley, where much of St. Vincent's fruits, vegetables and spices are grown.

- ·Visit Fort Charlotte dating back to 1763 and offering views over Kingston.
- ·View an oasis of serenity at the Botanical gardens



Drive through the bustling capital of Kingstown and the surrounding countryside, taking in the scenery and historical sights. Known as the "City of Arches" for its volcanic stone archways, Kingstown was first settled by the French. In the following decades, the island was ceded to the British, who built Fort Charlotte on a high bluff to protect Kingstown primarily from land attacks by the French and Caribs. Many of the landmarks in town are churches, and you will enjoy an exterior view of three of the most impressive ones. St. George's Anglican Church is known for its lovely stained-glass windows. St. Mary's Catholic Cathedral of the Assumption was built in stages and its eclectic architecture reflects the additions. Freed slaves help build Kingstown Methodist Church, a pastel-colored brick building. Leaving Kingstown behind, you will drive along the island's windward side, admiring the dramatic scenery, which includes black-sand beaches, rocky bluffs and coastal villages.

- ·Pass many of Kingstown's most historical landmarks
- ·View three churches, including one with stained-glass windows that Queen Victoria donated.
- ·Observe another church that freed slaves constructed.
- ·Behold the beautiful shoreline and coastal villages along the island's windward side.
- ·Sample coconut water and coconut meat or "jelly," a staple on the island.

The abundant marine life will be just as mesmerizing, as you can expect to spot sergeant majors, angelfish, white-spotted filefish and schools of soldierfish. In all likelihood, you will also see hawksbill and green turtles and perhaps divers in the deeper water. The remains of a 17th-century shipwreck, including cannons and chains, lie scattered about the ocean floor.

- ·Snorkel Champagne Reef, an underwater wonderland teeming with marine life.
- ·Watch the continuous streams of champagne-like bubbles rise from the ocean floor.
- ·Feel the warmth of the ocean floor from the geothermal activity below.
- Observe a variety of marine creatures, including tropical fish and hawksbill turtles.
- ·Bring towel, swimwear, comfortable clothing.
- ·Wear water shoes.

This tour requires a strenous amount of activity and participants should be in good physical condition and be able to swim. The captain will assess the weather and water conditions for the best spot to anchor, but chances are it will be just outside the harbor to maximize your snorkeling time. The waters there are crystal-clear and teeming with reef fish. You may spot brilliantly colored angelfish, large groupers and schools of queen triggerfish. One of the most curious-looking species is the four-eye butterflyfish, which is named for the two dark spots – or false eyes – on the sides of its tail, which are meant to confuse predators. You might also see green sea turtles gracefully swimming by and feeding on seagrass and algae on the reef. They are noteworthy as being the largest of all sea turtles and the only ones that are herbivores.

- ·Take an exhilarating ride across the harbor in a Rigid Inflatable Boat or RIB for short.







A short but eye-opening hike through Palo Colorado Forest follows. It is one of four different types of forests within El Yunque, so the foliage will be quite different than what you have seen previously.


