Applaud the splendid natural beauty of Southern Africa's western coast during this dolphin and seal cruise on the Walvis Bay Lagoon, Travel along a littoral road to the historic jetty at Swakopmund and board an open-air boat for a three-hour cruise in the renowned Walvis Bay Lagoon, declared a Wetland of International Importance as it is one of the most significant ecological sites along Southern Africa's western coast. You'll learn that the lagoon is well-known for its native bird species and vast array of intra-African and Palaearctic migrants, and find the water is usually very calm yet teeming with avian and marine life. Continue on to Pelican Point, a sand spit separating Walvis Bay from the Atlantic Ocean, where you'll likely encounter a large Cape fur seal colony, and watch for schools of heavyside and bottlenose dolphins that often swim alongside the boat. Keep a sharp lookout for white-chinned petrels, Wilson's storm petrels, cape gannets, pelicans and cormorants. During your cruise, you'll savor a delicious repast of fresh oysters, sparkling wine, soft drinks and a selection of open-faced sandwiches, a perfect accompaniment to your outdoor adventure.

- ·Embark an open-air boat for an in-depth exploration of the famed Walvis Bay Lagoon.
- Survey the lagoon's protected wetland, known for its plethora of avian species and marine life.

Perhaps see creatures like the sidewinding adder, the Palmetto gecko, the sand-diving lizard, the Namaqua chameleon and various other diminutive beetles, lizards and geckos that live and survive in the torrid desert conditions. You'll conclude your tour with a stop at Sundowner Dune to take in spectacular views over the Atlantic Ocean and enjoy refreshing orange juice and savory snacks. During your return along a scenic coastal road, contemplate the nearly ineffable beauty of the bewitching Namib and its resilient tenants.

- ·Board an off-road vehicle for an exhilarating outing into the breathtaking Namib Desert.
- ·Search the barren landscape for indigenous species that have adapted to the challenging environment.

WAL-012 SANDWICH HARBOUR

Explore the Sandwich Harbour area in a 4x4 vehicle that can negotiate vastly different, otherwise inaccessible terrains. As an introduction to the natural wonders, you will first stop at Walvis Lagoon, which attracts a remarkable variety of seabirds and thousands of pink flamingoes. The species that you see will depend on the season, as many of the birds are migratory. You will then travel south through Namib-Naukluft Park, a hauntingly beautiful arid landscape with towering sand dunes. A natural tidal lagoon rims the coast, whose sparse vegetation stabilizes the dunes, which would otherwise shift dramatically. If the tides and ocean swells permit, you will drive to the lagoon along the beach. If not, you will travel entirely across the surrounding dunes, some of which rise more than 200 feet above sea level. Either way, you can expect to see a massive number of water birds, including cormorants, terns and waders.



You'll see the town's colonial past reflected in the early 19th-century art nouveau architecture found on many appealing buildings that have been declared national monuments. Discover the neo-Baroque German Evangelical Lutheran Church and the elegant historic Railway Station, which is now the Swakopmund Hotel's reception area. After passing the town's historic jetty, you'll walk to the Karakulia Weavers where Karakul sheep wool is spun, dyed and woven into rugs and wall hangings. Explore the Kristall Gallery, which displays crystals weighing up to 14 tons, and appreciate free time at the Brauhaus Gallery, a town center shopping arcade. En route back to Walvis Bay, you'll pause for photos at Dune 7, the highest sand dune in the area, then make a brief stop at the Walvis Bay Lagoon and tidal flood plains, declared a Wetland of International Importance, and marvel at its rich marine life and myriad bird species.

- ·Uncover early 19th-century art nouveau architecture in Swakopmund, a seaside resort town that evokes a Bavarian village.
- See the lovely neo-Baroque German Evangelical Lutheran Church and the ornate former Railway Station.
- ·View the town's beloved jetty and the Karakulia Weavers, where sheep wool is made into rugs and wall hangings.
- Study crystals up to 14 tons at the Kristall Gallery and browse the shops in the Brauhaus Gallery.
- ·Capture dramatic photos at the commanding Dune 7, the area's tallest sand dune.
- Observe the Walvis Bay Lagoon and tidal flood plains, recognized internationally for its environmental importance.

You'll proceed to the Welwitschia Valley, where thousands of bizarre welwitschia plants are scattered about. After stopping to view these distinctive specimens as well as a variety of interesting lichens, you'll continue to a scenic location for a refreshment of orange juice and savory snacks. Pause for photos at Dune 7, the highest sand dune in the area, then make a brief stop at the Walvis Bay Lagoon and tidal flood plains, declared a Wetland of International Importance for its abundance of marine life, pelicans and a wealth of other avian species.

Travel a coastal road to Mondesa Township, which was established in the early 1950s to provide housing for Owambo, Damara and Herero people working in the city of Swakopmund. You'll find that this district, just a brief distance from Swakopmund's center, reveals a radically different world from the tourist center, providing you with an invaluable opportunity for personal growth by interacting with the friendly families who reside there. Observe the inhabitants' daily life during an approximately three-hour customized tour that engages you in the resident's everyday activities, and learn some of the region's history to assist you in bridging the cultural gap and achieving increased understanding. Take in a fascinating demonstration on the preparation of the cereal grain mahangu, taste unusual but delicious food and enjoy the dancing of the local children. In addition to benefitting from your immersion into a much different way of life, you'll feel gratified that a portion of your visitor's fee is contributed to a community fund that honors and supports the district's citizens.

- ·Visit Mondesa Township, a culturally diverse district of Swakopmund built to house the city's workers.
- Meet the resident families, a priceless opportunity to grasp a culture likely entirely different from your own.
- ·Further your knowledge of the township's history to better understand life in Mondesa.
- Sample flavorful local dishes and watch the preparation of a cereal grain known as mahangu.
- Applaud the joyous dancing of the district's children.
- Appreciate that a portion of your fee supports Mondesa's citizens.
- •Wear casual, weather-appropriate clothing and comfortable walking shoes. •Bring a hat, sunglasses and sunscreen.



Cruise across Walvis Bay in a catamaran for a kayaking adventure from Pelican Point and return in a 4x4 vehicle that's ideal for negotiating the salt pans and sand dunes. While cruising, you will enjoy spectacular views of Walvis Bay and the surrounding natural areas. As you will notice even before disembarking, long slender Pelican Point is a haven for wildlife. Thousands of Cape fur seals frolic in the sea and along the coast, bottlenose and Heaviside's dolphins often breach the water's surface and seabirds are seemingly everywhere, especially pelicans, cormorants and petrels. Chances are, you will be treated to an even closer look at the bountiful marine life and wildlife while kayaking through the typically calm waters. A different sort of adventure awaits once you hop in the 4x4 vehicle and race off across the salt pans, along Donkey Bay and up into the sand dunes. The views along the way will be absolutely magnificent.

- ·Enjoy a scenic cruise aboard a catamaran across Walvis Bay to Pelican Point.
- Kayak off Pelican Point, a thin finger of land that enormous numbers of seals and seabirds inhabit.
- ·Look for bottlenose and Heaviside's dolphins, often swimming right next to your kayak.

Gain insight into local life by driving into the Namib Desert in a 4x4 vehicle to a village of indigenous Topnaars and on to a seaside city that the Germans colonized on the edge of the arid terrain. While enjoying a cup of mint tea in a family home in the inland village, you will learn about the Topnaar culture and how the people rely on the protein-rich !nara melon – the fruit's odd spelling with an exclamation point denotes its pronunciation with a tongue click. You will discover more about the incredibly versatile melon at a factory that processes it for vitamins, cosmetics, sunscreens and vinaigrettes. A historical perspective of the desert awaits you in Swakopmund, a resort city wedged between Namibia's rust-red dunes and the sea. The guide will describe the city's founding in 1892 as you explore the oldest building and climb to the top of Woermann Tower for a panoramic 360° view. Shopping follows.

Journey to the ecologically indispensable Walvis Bay Lagoon, declared a Wetland of International Importance, and begin your quest to identify the wide variety of shore birds and waders who congregate there, including sandpipers, plovers, pelicans and herons, depending upon the season. You'll enter the sedimentation pans of the expansive Walvis Bay Salt Holdings, the largest producer of solar sea salt in sub-Saharan Africa, and enjoy a close-up view of the many resident birds, perhaps even seeing phalaropes, grebes and terns, including the rare Damara tern. Travel farther along the beach to Pelican Point and discover a large Cape fur seal colony, along with osprey and exotic African black oystercatchers. Depending upon the weather and time of day, you'll possibly glimpse the dune or sabota lark and perhaps recognize an Orange River white-eye on your return through the enthralling Kuiseb River delta, a fabulous site in which to round out your unforgettable bird-watching foray

- ·See a plethora of avian species, such as sandpipers, plovers, herons and pelicans.

Marvel at a vast national park that is distinguished by massive sand dunes and otherworldly terrain during a tour of a remarkable desert environment. Settle in for an approximately 30-minute drive to Dune 7, the region's largest sand dune, and perhaps find sand-boarders and skiers zipping down its slope. Continuing on, you'll enter the Namib-Naukluft National Park, which includes part of the Namib Desert and is the country's largest nature preserve, and notice its striking rusty-hued sand dunes, whose colors vary due to the iron in the sand oxidizing to a darker shade as the dunes age. In spite of the seemingly harsh conditions, find flora and fauna thriving here, such as the raggedy welwitschia, which resembles wilted lettuce and produces only two leaves in its up to 500-year lifetime. You'll journey to Moon Landscape, a vastly eroded valley that is reminiscent of the lunar surface. Discover that even though the environment appears to be barren, it supports a complex ecosystem of lichens and shrubs subsisting on the occasional moisture provided by sea fog that rolls in from as far as 20 miles away. You'll wonder at nature's incredible adaptability during this fascinating excursion.

- ·•Stand in awe at Dune 7, a massive sand dune enjoyed by sand-boarders and skiers.
- •Experience the Namib-Naukluft National Park, a striking natural preserve that includes part of the Namib Desert.
- ·•Discern the age of a sand dune from the depth of its rust color, due to oxidation through the years.
- ··Wonder at the hardiness of the flora and fauna that thrive in the arid desert conditions.

WAL-GG1 SWAKOPMUND AND BEACH CLEAN-UP

Gain a historical perspective of Swakopmund before helping the town overcome its ecological challenges by joining a beach clean-up. As the guide describes the area's colonial founding and early years, you will have the opportunity to climb Woermann Tower for a sweeping view of the downtown. Swakopmund is wedged between Namibia's rust-red coastal dunes and the sea, two wildly different settings. You will see many of the creatures that inhabit these waters at the National Marine Aquarium, the only such attraction in Namibia. The cold Benguela Current brushes the coast, attracting marine life such as fur seals and Heaviside's dolphin, perhaps the least-known of all cetaceans because it is endemic to the Benguela ecosystem. The current also carries trash, particularly discarded plastic, that endangers the marine life that mistakenly ingests it. You may choose to drive or bicycle to the beach in need of clean-up and join the effort to remove trash that has washed up.

- ·View the historical architecture in Swakopmund that reflects the town's colonial years .
- ·Browse the National Marine Aquarium, which holds marine life endemic to the region .
- ·Help clean up a beach where plastic trash accumulates that could be harmful to marine life .
- ·Dress in weather-appropriate clothing .
- ·Wear flat comfortable walking shoes .

WAL-GG2 TOPNAAR SUSTAINABLE VILLAGE VISIT

Interact with the indigenous Topnaar people in a desert village and then join them in removing trash from a dry riverbed nearby. Despite the harsh conditions, the Topnaars have lived in the area for centuries by herding cattle, gardening and feasting on melons that surprisingly grow naturally in the bone-dry terrain. You will learn about the extraordinary Topnaar culture while enjoying mint tea with a family in their home. Most possessions are communal, except for the melon bushes that each family owns. The protein-rich fruit, known as Inara—with an exclamation point to denote its pronunciation with a tongue click—is that essential to the Topnaars' survival. The nearby Kuiseb River is also critically important, although it flows intermittently and often dries up before reaching the sea. To help keep the riverbed clean, you and several villagers will remove some of the trash that may have washed downstream when the river was active.
