OVERVIEW Prepare classic Turkish dishes in a hands-on cooking class at a restaurant in Bergama, an ancient city whose Greek and Roman ruins reveal much about its past. The focus will soon turn to food, especially locally sourced products such as the ones that you will prepare in class with the assistance of the restaurant's chef. Although the exact menu will depend on which ingredients are freshest and most readily available, it typically features a variety of local favorites. Possibilities for mezes include shepherd's salad, warmed goat cheese and yuvalama, a yogurt-based soup made with lamb and beef. Lamb will also likely be the main ingredient in the entrée as it is often adana kebab. After you have prepared the dishes, you will enjoy them for lunch along with a glass or two of local wine.

- Learn to make classic Turkish dishes in a hands-on cooking class.

You will be served a variety of dishes that will likely range from seasonal vegetables lightly cooked in olive oil to grilled seabass, a lean flaky fish that is farmed throughout Turkey. A selection of local wines, both red and white, will complement the meal.

While walking along the winding cobblestone streets in Ayvalik's atmospheric older district, you will notice that the architecture is decidedly Greek and see a Greek Orthodox Church that was converted into a mosque. Much the same is true of Cunda Island, which you will reach via a causeway that connects it to the mainland. Traditional Greek-style stone houses are most everywhere. You will discover more about the area's history at the Rahmi Koç Museum, a former church whose collection include antique cars, model ships and household items that reflect the local lifestyle. After browsing, you will dine at one of the island's many seafood restaurants.

- Recognize the Greek influence that is still highly evident in Ayvalik and Cunda Island.
- Walk along the wonderfully atmospheric streets in both areas and admire the architecture.
- Browse a collection of artifacts in a museum that was a former Greek Orthodox church.
