As you pass the Oceanographic Museum, you may notice that it is built right into the rock cliff, making it one Monaco's most distinctive buildings. Nearby, you will find the magnificent Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception, where in 1956 Prince Rainier II married Grace Kelly in what was hailed as the wedding of the century. You will also see the palace of the reigning prince. The farm To Perivoli sti Vari – meaning The Orchard in Vari – is an oasis of a different sort. It lies in the town of Vari in the southern outskirts of Athens and grows organic vegetables based on the principle of permaculture, a regenerative form of agriculture that enhances rather than depletes the natural environment. It is a difference that you can taste. Enjoy a tasting of a variety of olive oils before your meal. The menu at the farm's restaurant is seasonal, ensuring that everything will be exceptionally fresh, organic and follow a farm-to-table philosophy.

Watch injured and ill sea turtles being rehabilitated at Archelon, an organization that monitors, rescues and cares for sea turtles and their habitats. Many of the sea turtles at the facility are loggerheads, the most common turtle species in the Mediterranean. Even so, their numbers are dwindling because their nesting beaches are being lost and the turtles are accidentally being caught in fishing nets. As you tour Archelon's sea turtle rehabilitation center, you can expect to see injured turtles being treated in hopes of releasing them back into the wild one day. The organization also aims to educate the public to better understand the region's marine biodiversity, the impact of pollution on all wildlife and the importance of sustainable practices. You might also learn how satellites are used to track loggerhead turtles as they migrate to and from their nesting sites in the Mediterranean.

- See how turtles such as loggerheads are treated so they can be released back into the wild .
