The sound is a body of impossibly turquoise water that fills the bend in the distinctive fishhook shape of Bermuda. A coral reef at the mouth shelters the inner waters, making for a typically calm cruise on the open-concept catamaran. Feel free to move about the vessel or settle in wherever you are most comfortable. You might lounge on the trampoline bow nets, ascend to the sun deck and relax under the covered stern cockpit. There is plenty of space, as the catamaran is 60 feet long. The views are always spectacular in the sound, but particularly so when the sun begins to dip below the horizon, painting the sky in bold shades of yellow, orange and red. The bar will be open and serving unlimited rum swizzles throughout the cruise, making for a festive atmosphere.

The electric-enhanced bicycle, commonly known as an e-bike, will boost your pedal power, allowing you to ride farther and negotiate hills with considerably less effort. After an orientation on how best to maximize the experience, you will ride off through some of the most beautiful areas of Bermuda. You will follow a route that trains traveled until 1948, when the government closed the railways for lack of use and the high cost of maintenance. In the mid-1980s, the train rails were removed and the route was converted into a trail. The sights will vary depending on the section that you follow. Regardless, you can expect to ride along the coast, past magnificent waterfront homes and occasionally off-road. Towards the end of the ride, you will enjoy free time to swim at the beach.

- Bicycle the easy way on an electric-enhanced bike that will boost your pedal power.
- Follow a former railway route that has been converted into a biking and walking trail.

One of the world's first cast-iron lighthouses, it was constructed in the 1840s before steel was readily available for building purposes. Today, the Dockyard has become one of Bermuda's most visited and bustling areas. As you meander through the easy-to-negotiate streets, you will pass an array of excellent restaurants, galleries featuring local artists and one-of-a-kind boutiques, as well as the expansive Bermuda Craft Market, a collection of shops with merchandise ranging from jewelry to needlework. You may also pass the National Museum of Bermuda, which offers an in-depth look into the island's past. By the end of this orientation tour of the compact Dockyard, you should have an excellent idea of which attractions you wish to explore further on your own.

- Walk through the compact Royal Naval Dockyard at a comfortable pace.

OVERVIEW Sail along the western shore of St Barts on a catamaran and then snorkel in the turquoise waters just off shore. No roads lead to the bay and that relative seclusion ensures a pristine environment for the abundant marine life. Once the catamaran anchors, you will be free to snorkel or stay onboard and just enjoy the natural beauty. Snorkelers may spot brightly colored butterflyfish, schools of grunts and French angelfish, a thin disc-shaped fish that often travels in pairs. Sea turtles tend to congregate in the beds of seagrass and it is quite the thrill to watch one gracefully swim by. The large uninhabited island that you will see a bit farther north is Ile Fourchue.

- Cruise along the beautiful leeward coast of St Barts on a catamaran.
- Enjoy the spectacular tropical views, especially in the island's natural marine reserve.

Race across Gustavia Harbor in an open-air boat for a snorkeling adventure that will be just as thrilling as the ride there. The captain will assess the weather and water conditions for the best spot to anchor, but chances are it will be just outside the harbor to maximize your snorkeling time. The waters there are crystal-clear and teeming with reef fish. You may spot brilliantly colored angelfish, large groupers and schools of queen triggerfish. One of the most curious-looking species is the four-eye butterflyfish, which is named for the two dark spots – or false eyes – on the sides of its tail, which are meant to confuse predators. You might also see green sea turtles gracefully swimming by and feeding on seagrass and algae on the reef. They are noteworthy as being the largest of all sea turtles and the only ones that are herbivores.

- Take an exhilarating ride across the harbor in a open-air boat for short.
- Snorkel in the crystal-clear waters at a reef teeming with fish and other marine life.
- Watch for green sea turtles, an endangered but relatively abundant species.
- Dress in weather-appropriate clothing.
- Wear a swimsuit and bring a towel.
- Wear flat, comfortable walking shoes.

This tour includes a moderate amount of activity and access on and off the boat can be challenging. Getting back onboard requires the use of a parrot ladder of 6 steps. Participants should be good swimmers and **MUST** be in good physical condition to get on and off the boat. Now an artificial reef teeming with brightly colored tropical fish, the fishing boat sunk in 1995 during Hurricane Luis. More spectacular underwater sights await you as the semi-submersible heads into St. Barths' Marine Reserve. Angelfish, sergeant majors, spotted moray eels and tarpon are just a few of the creatures that inhabit the reserve's protected reefs. On the approach to a group of three rocky islands known as The Saints, the crew will attract even more fish by feeding them. It will be quite the spectacle, especially if sharks join the frenzy.

- Cruise in and around Gustavia harbor in a semi-submersible vessel.
- Observe the underwater world through the large viewing windows down below.
- Take in the gorgeous scenery out on deck, if you prefer.
- Pass over a shipwreck and coral reefs teeming with marine life.
- Watch the feeding frenzy as the crew tosses fish food into the water.
- Dress in weather-appropriate clothing.
- Wear flat comfortable walking shoes.

There are very steep stairs to negotiate to enter and exit the submersible; therefore, this tour is not suitable for wheelchair guests. You'll see it all clearly from this 32-foot boat designed expressly for this purpose; just settle into a shaded seat and look through the window that runs along the floor of the vessel. It's a relaxed and unimposing way to take in wonders usually hidden under the surface. And it's a scene that continuously changes as the boat slowly motors over one reef, then another. While there's no telling exactly what will come into view, you can expect to see graceful sea turtles coasting in the currents and a full spectrum of colorful fish among the reef corals, including wrasses, grunts, goatfish, parrotfish and tangs. The onboard naturalist can help with fish identification or questions, and there are illustrated Caribbean fish charts on board as well. After about 75 minutes spent surveying this marvelous environment, you'll return to the pier. Dry and content.

- See what's going on underwater in Bonaire's reefs without getting your feet – or anything else – wet.
- Take your shaded seat on a 32-foot glass-bottom boat headed for Bonaire Marine Park.
- Glide slowly from reef to reef in this protected reserve, watching an everchanging scene of corals, turtles, colorful fish and other marine life.

You will delve deeper into the challenges of protecting Bonaire's birds, especially parrots, when touring the center with a naturalist. It will be inspiring to see how the birds are rescued, rehabilitated and eventually released back into the wild. To enhance your experience and understanding of Bonaire's endangered Amazon parrots, you will follow the naturalist into a replanted section of dry forest looking for these magnificent birds. Chunky and brightly colored, they are easy to identify. The birds are usually seen in pairs that remain monogamous throughout their lives, which typically last about 40 years on Bonaire.

- Tour a conservation center that rehabilitates yellow-shouldered Amazon parrots.
- Hike through a replanted forest looking for parrots with a naturalist guide.
- Admire Bonaire's extraordinary natural beauty on a panoramic drive around the island.

Capture panoramas at Tolo Beach, a spectacular stretch of sand also known as Ol' Blue. You might see wild donkeys lazing about; they've been island residents ever since Spaniards brought their ancestors here 500 years ago. They feed in the saltwater shallows here, using their upside-down beaks to scoop up brine shrimp – a diet that gives them their trademark rosy-orange hue. Stopping at Dos Pos, a drinking well at a nearby plantation, you're likely to spot other birds including lively yellow bananaquits. Once at Rincon, the island's oldest town, you'll take a well-earned outdoor rest at the Rose Inn, then leave your wheels behind and hop aboard ours for the return drive to Kralendijk.

- Get fitted and head out for 12 miles of freewheeling tropical exploration by mountain bike.
- Pedal along a coastal path that also turns inland after rounding a flamingo-favored salt lake.
- Pass beautiful beachfront and wander an abandoned old plantation.
- Be on the lookout for wild donkeys and stop by a drinking well that birds frequent.

Head into the arid wilds of the Washikemba reserve on an All-Terrain Vehicle and experience a hauntingly beautiful landscape. Four-wheeling your way into this rugged region, you'll reach areas most normal vehicles can't – letting you encounter Bonaire in its most natural, undisturbed state. You might even see wild donkeys and goats, and iguanas basking in the sun. At the amazingly remote Spelonk Lighthouse, marking the island's easternmost point, you can't help but notice that the only other way here is by sketchy footpath. And it's sure to be an inspiring moment when you also realize that the only sound you can hear here is surf crashing on a rocky shore. Once you've absorbed that awhile, it's on to one of Bonaire's many caves, some still bearing inscriptions from Arawak Indians who lived here in pre-Columbian days. Today's cave residents are likely to be bats, clinging to the roof in great numbers as they wait for dusk to fly off in search of tasty insects. It's a good thing your dinner plans are elsewhere.

- Experience Bonaire's arid landscape in its natural state in the Washikemba reserve.
- Make your way there by All-Terrain Vehicle, which can take you where other vehicles can't.
- Find yourself at a far-off lighthouse where the only sound is the ocean, or maybe a wild goat.
- Visit a cave where ancients might once have lived, but now only bats. Lots and lots of bats.

After about an hour you'll tender back to the Samur to enjoy tropical fruits and rum punch on the return sail.

Before long, the paved highway will be in the rearview as you enter trackless, arid countryside. This sparsely populated part of the island is both beautiful and rugged. You're usually more likely to encounter wild donkeys, Caribbean parakeets, yellow-shouldered parrots or prehistoric-looking iguanas than humans around here. One exception is when you reach Sorobon Beach, catering to windsurfers who can't resist the waves kicked up by the steady offshore breezes. After a pause, you'll press on to pass one of Bonaire's five lighthouses then clustered stone huts that once housed slaves who worked in the surrounding salt flats until slavery was brought to an end here in 1863. These saltwater shallows are a known place where Bonaire's flamingoes gather to feed, using their upside-down beaks to scoop up brine shrimp – the unique diet responsible for their trademark rosy-orange hue. Perhaps they'll be hungry when you're passing through.

- Explore an arid, undeveloped part of Bonaire where the scenery is all about rugged beauty.
- Be on the lookout for wild donkeys, chattering parrots, and iguanas lounging in the sun.
- Stop at a faraway, breeze-swept beach where the waves are irresistible to windsurfers.
- Visit salt flats where flamingoes often congregate to feed, and stand around on one leg.
- Wear light-weight clothing.
- Flat, closed-toe shoes are required.
- Bring a hat, sunglasses and sunscreen.

This tour includes a limited amount of walking, mainly at guests' discretion during the stops. The off-road terrain can be bumpy and there are high steps involved in entering and exiting the vehicle. Sea turtles also thrive here in the protected park waters. This optional snorkeling is unguided, but a crew member will be keeping a watchful eye out from the deck. After about an hour at anchor, the sails will be raised again for the voyage back to harbor, with an open bar en route.

- Skim over clear Caribbean waters aboard a sleek and roomy sailing cat named Mushi Mushi.
- Cross into the long-protected Bonaire Marine Park and moor for a blissful while.
- Choose you pleasure: relaxing and sunbathing on board or investigating the reef by snorkel.
- Under the surface, encounter a world of lush corals, sea turtles, colorful fish and invertebrates.
- Toast the wonders of the sea during the open-bar return sail to Kralendijk.
- Wear swimwear under a cover-up and bring a towel from the ship.
- Flat, comfortable shoes with non-slip sole or aqua socks are recommended.
- Bring a hat, sunglasses and sunscreen as needed.

- Wear flat comfortable walking shoes with rubber soles.

This tour includes limited walking. It is not available to wheelchair guests and those with mobility concerns should evaluate their personal level of stamina and ability before joining the tour, as participants must be able to make their own way into and out of the ferry vessel. There is also an 11-step steep ladder to negotiate to enter and exit the submarine. To experience color changes at various depths, guests may choose to wear clothes with red or fluorescent colors. The minimum height requirement to participate in the tour is 36 inches and children must be at least 4 years of age and accompanied by an adult parent or guardian. The ferry vessel and submarine may not be exclusive to cruise line guests.

Gain an appreciation for Aruba's remarkable diversity by visiting some of the island's traditional attractions and more unusual ones such as an ostrich farm. As far as manmade sites, few are more striking than the soaring California Lighthouse. Aruba's oldest lighthouse, the beacon is named to honor a ship that sank here in 1891, before the island constructed its first lighthouse. Continuing on, the terrain will become much more arid, an ideal landscape for cacti, Aruba's signature divi-divi trees, iguanas and wild goats. The jumble of massive boulders known as the Casibari Rock formations rise out of this desert-like environment and are well worth closer inspection. Ostriches also thrive here, as you will discover at a farm that breeds these flightless birds, which are the world's largest. Finally, you will pause for photos of the Baby Natural Bridge, a coral rock formation that spanned a finger of the sea until it collapsed in 2005

- Visit the island's oldest lighthouse, a soaring beacon that offers stunning vistas.
- Travel through a desert-like landscape full of divi-divi trees shaped by tradewinds.
- Visit a farm that breeds ostriches and emus.
- Marvel at the oddly shaped Casibari Rock formations that shifting tectonic plates created.
- Behold the remains of a natural coral bridge that the erosive force of nature leveled.
- Dress in weather-appropriate clothing.
- Wear flat comfortable walking shoes.

This tour involves limited walking, mainly at the guests' discretion. The tour has limited wheelchair availability and wheelchair guests must have a collapsible wheelchair, be able to make their own way on and off the coach and have a companion to assist them. Guests with mobility concerns should evaluate their personal level of stamina and ability before joining the tour. Feeding the ostriches is permitted, but please use caution when doing so. Remove jewelry and sunglasses before feeding the birds. Some venues charge to use the restrooms.
