Gain a historical and cultural understanding of Lombok through the island's most representative attractions, including 18th-century Lingsar Temple. Considered a symbol of harmony because people of all religions have long been welcome, Lingsar is the largest and most significant temple on the island. As you meander about, the aroma of incense and jasmine will likely be wafting through the air. The highlight of Mayura Water Palace, another 18th-century landmark, is its floating pavilion surrounded by mangosteen trees, whose fruit is often used for medicinal purposes. The setting is absolutely beautiful. Shopping for locally made merchandise will be offered at two venues—Sesela Market and the Sukarara Craft Village. The market offers an array of items, but especially wooden handicrafts. Stores in the craft village focus more on clothing made from songket, a brocade-like fabric created by intricately hand-weaving metallic threads with silk or cotton yarn.

- Shop for handmade goods ranging from jewelry to wooden crafts at the Sesela Art Market.
- Browse the Sukarara Craft Village for fine apparel made with songket fabric.
- Visit Lingsar Temple, a Hindu shrine that welcomes people of other faiths, as well.
- Behold the Myura Water Palace, a beautiful thatched pavilion that seems to float in a lake.
- Dress in weather-appropriate clothing.
- Wear flat comfortable walking shoes.

Become familiar with the most intriguing landmarks in and around Mataram and come away with a broad cultural understanding of Lombok. Just outside the provincial capital, you will find Lingsar Temple, a Hindu shrine that also welcomes people of other faiths. It is said to be good luck if you can lure one of its pond eels to eat a hard-boiled egg, which vendors sell nearby. For a glimpse into the creative side of the island, you will browse Sesela Art Market, a center for fine wooden handicrafts. Furniture inlaid with polished shell fragments is the specialty, while pearl jewelry is the most popular merchandise at the next destination. Still, few places lend more insight into the local culture than the Nusa Tenggara Barat Museum. Its collection contains a remarkable variety of artifacts such as divining stones that ward off evil, ethnic wedding costumes and Chinese pottery from the 10th century.

- See attractions that best represent the cultural diversity in Mataram, the provincial capital.
- Shop for local merchandise such as handmade wooden crafts and pearl jewelry.
- Visit Lingsar Temple, a Hindu shrine that welcomes people of other faiths, as well.

Shop for handmade arts and crafts in two village markets renowned for their highly skilled traditional artisans. Wooden products are the specialty of the craftspeople at the Sesela Art Market, and you may see them hand-carving intricate friezes, lacquering boxes and inlaying wooden furniture with decorative shells. The process is slow and that meticulousness shows in the merchandise. Colorful textiles, beaded jewelry and woven rattan goods are also plentiful at the art market. Songket weaving is the signature technique practiced at the Sukarara Craft Village. To create songket fabric, the artisans hand-weave metallic threads together with silk or cotton yarn. As you will discover, the technique is so exacting that it can take a month to make one item. Songket fabrics usually feature traditional motifs and are brightly colored with natural dyes that resist fading. Weaving is so important to the village that nearly every house has its own loom.

- Shop for handmade goods ranging from jewelry to wooden crafts at the Sesela Art Market.
- Browse the Sukarara Craft Village for fine apparel made with songket fabric.
- Watch the artisans in Sukarara painstakingly weave the songket fabric on hand looms.
- Dress in weather-appropriate clothing.

Watch grass roof thatch being woven in the village of Sekotong and spend nearly two hours lounging blissfully on Cocotinus Beach. While driving toward the village, you will notice that many of the residences have grass roofs. A tour of the factory that makes the thatching will be enlightening as you will see firsthand how rice straw and bundles of Kunai grass, known locally as alang-alang, are woven into roof panels. Although made entirely of natural materials, the thatched roofs are leak-proof and last up to 20 years, even in tropical conditions. Free time follows at Cocotinus Beach, a tranquil setting near the southwestern tip of Lombok Island. You will have the opportunity to swim in the crystalline waters that rim the beach and stroll along the shore with nothing on your mind but enjoying yourself. Or simply stretch out on a beach towel and bask in the sun.

- Watch how eco-friendly roof panels are manufactured from rice straw and Kunai grass.
- Lounge about Cocotinus Beach doing pretty much whatever you like.
- Enjoy an invigorating swim in the sea's crystal-clear waters.
- Dress in weather-appropriate clothing with a swimsuit underneath.
- Bring a towel and sunscreen.
- Wear flat comfortable walking shoes.

Walk through the tropical vegetation on Komodo Island, looking for Komodo dragons, massive lizards that can weigh more than 300 pounds. You will follow a park ranger through Komodo National Park, a UNESCO World Heritage site that is home to these rare lizards. Thought to be remnants of an ancient order of monitor lizards, the dragons are fierce, ominous-looking creatures with sharp, saw-like teeth and menacing eyes. See one in the wild, and it will leave a lasting impression. The dragons live on the deer and pigs that inhabit the island and are surprisingly agile and fast when covering short distances. They are also good swimmers and relentless when tracking prey. As you walk the dirt paths, the park ranger will describe the intriguing habits of the Komodo dragons and the island's other animals.

- Follow a park ranger through Komodo Island, seeking Komodo dragons in the wild.
- Hear the blood-curdling details of how these giant lizards relentlessly hunt their prey.
- Listen as the park ranger describes the lizards' physical characteristics.
- Dress in weather-appropriate clothing that is not red.
- Wear flat comfortable walking shoes that can easily be cleaned.
- Bring a plastic bag to protect valuable items in case of a sudden downpour.

Tour duration can vary, depending on the pace of the participants and the trail that the rangers choose to find Komodo dragons. The tour may include up to 1½ hours of walking over dirt paths that can become muddy and strenuous with rain. The tour is not suitable for wheelchair guests, those with mobility concerns or guests with open wounds, as Komodo dragons are easily attracted to blood. Participants must stay with the groups and not try to get close to the dragons or to feed them. Komodo dragons roam the island freely and wildlife sightings are not guaranteed.

The lovely pink sand isn't a result of the island's volcanic formation, but rather from fragments of red coral that wash ashore and blend with the natural white sand, turning it pink. This idyllic beach offers the perfect setting to unwind, with its shallow waters, ideal for a refreshing swim and ample space to simply bask in the sun.

- Look for Komodo dragons – the world's largest lizard – while walking in the woods.
- Hear about the lizards' unusual behavior, especially when tracking prey.
- Relax as you please on a soft pink-sand beach along the island's southern shore.
- Bask in the sun, swim in the sea or snorkel the coral reefs just offshore.

Visit a 1,000-acre natural bushland park where every manner of Aussie wildlife can be encountered. After a scenic coach drive from Darwin to Territory Wildlife Park, you'll be oriented by park staff equipped with maps and helpful suggestions, then see loose to chart your own preferred course through the array of native animal exhibits and experiences available here. There's no need to hike the four miles of trails that wind among the woodlands, wetlands and tropical forest, either – shuttles circulate around the entire park, providing informative commentary as they move from one stop to another. Among the most popular are the underwater walk-through aquarium, where you're surrounded by gliding whip rays and other colorful marine life, and a Nocturnal House that offers a rare glimpse into the curious lives and habits of many species seldom seen in the wild. Another special enclosure holds impressive scheduled performances where the park's birds of prey show off their skills in full flight. At a pre-determined time, you'll return to the designated pick-up point for the return to Darwin.

- Travel by coach across scenic Northern Territory terrain to a native Aussie wildlife park large enough to qualify as a territory of its own.
- Equipped with a map and ideas of what you'd most like to see, explore the park independently.
- Use convenient park trolley shuttles and walking paths to move between exhibits and experiences.
- Stroll a walk-through aquarium, enter a fascinating Nocturnal House, watch a thrilling birds of prey demonstration, tour an enormous rainforest aviary, and more.
- Wear weather-appropriate clothing.
- Flat, comfortable walking shoes are recommended.
- Bring a hat, sunglasses and sunscreen as needed.

This tour includes a moderate amount of walking mainly at the guest's discretion. It is available to guests who utilize a collapsible wheelchair, can both make their way on and off the coach and have a companion to assist them. Those guests with mobility concerns are cautioned to evaluate their personal level of ability and stamina. It is important that guests return to the designated pick-up point at the time advised by the driver.

DRW-006 DARWIN'S MILITARY PAST

You don't need to be a buff to be blown away by this tour of sights showcasing Darwin's wartime heritage. This tropical city on the Timor Sea played a pivotal role in the battle against the Japanese during World War II, as Northern Territory airfields were used to carry out bombing and anti-intruder sorties. But war always has its cost, and these provocations of the enemy made Darwin a constant target for retaliatory bombings. Some 64 air raids rained down on Darwin over a two-year period, resulting in many lost Australian lives and 12 sunken ships in the harbor. You can see actual film footage of the bombings along with many other wartime artifacts during your visit to East Point Military Museum, out on a scenic spit of land at the harbor entrance. Heading further inland, you'll tour the sprawling aircraft collection at the Australian Aviation Heritage Centre. The showstopper here is a massive B-52 bomber on permanent loan from the U.S., but also on display are a B-25 Mitchell, Mirage and Sabre jet fighters, a US Army Huey Cobra with rocket pods and Gatling gun, a Mark VIII Spitfire replica and the fascinating wreckage of a Japanese Mitsubishi Zero.

- Travel by coach to East Point for panoramic photos of Darwin Harbor, twice the size of Sydney's.
- Tour the East Point Military Museum, filled with photos and artifacts from Darwin's wartime history.
- Watch footage of repeated Japanese bombing raids that rained down on Darwin during 1942-43.
- Visit the Darwin Aviation Museum, housing one of Australia's foremost collections of military and civil aircraft – from early pioneers to jet-age exotics like delta-wing Vulcans and Concorde.
- See a rare B-52 bomber, Mirage and Sabre fighters, a fully-armed Huey Cobra and many others.
- Wear weather-appropriate clothing.
- Flat, comfortable walking shoes are recommended.
- Bring a hat, sunglasses and sunscreen as needed.

This tour involves a moderate amount of walking; it is available to wheelchair guests and those with mobility concerns who are able to make their way on and off the coach. The Aviation Heritage Centre is not air-conditioned. Museum exhibits may be upgraded, added or removed without notice. The order of sights visited may vary and the itinerary may be reversed.

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DRW-008 LITCHFIELD PRIVATE WATERFALL BY HELICOPTER

Fly high over Litchfield National Park in a helicopter for a bird's-eye view of this ancient land where Aboriginal people have lived for thousands of years. The helicopter seats just five passengers so you will be assured of an excellent view of the natural wonders, which include steep escarpments, lush forests and massive sandstone outcroppings that resemble a lost city. You will also see several waterfalls before touching down on one of the park's highest spots, where you will find a private cascade that is difficult to reach other than by air. In this idyllic setting, you can take a refreshing swim or just sit back and enjoy the serenity. The return flight will be just as captivating as you will soar over the dam that holds Darwin's main water supply and a collection of towering cathedral-like termite mounds that the insects ingeniously constructed in a direction that minimizes sun exposure to keep the interiors cool.

- Soar over the natural wonders in Litchfield National Park in a helicopter.
- Enjoy a birds-eye view of steep cliffs, enormous sandstone outcroppings and waterfalls.
- Land by a private waterfall and take a refreshing swim in the crocodile-free waters.
- See massive termite mounds that last up to 50 years, the average lifespan of the queen.
- Dress in weather-appropriate clothing with a swimsuit underneath.
- Bring a towel, hat and sunscreen.
- Wear flat comfortable walking shoes.

Guest is unable to exceed weight limit of 130kg per person including bag or camera. This tour is not suitable for those who are full-time wheelchair users and those with mobility difficulties as you will be walking around and will need to get in and out of the helicopter and people mover. The decision of the pilot in command is final with regards to cancelling a flight due to inclement weather and/or the refusal of the passenger/s if the passenger/s are deemed unfit for flight. Rain &/or heavy cloud cover may result in an altered flight path or result in cancellations of flights if flights are cancelled due to weather. Seat allocation including window seats for scheduled flights are decided based on weight and balance and at the discretion of the pilot or ground crew to ensure the safe carriage of all passengers. If water levels are deemed to be unsafe guests may be refused the opportunity to participate in swimming.

Travel by coach through Australia's tropical Top End to the Adelaide River, then embark on a cruise that brings you nearly face-to-jaws with jumping crocodiles. Yes, you read that right: jumping, snaggle-toothed, claw-footed crocs. And we're not talking about little hops, these are full-tilt leaps of almost a full body length out of the water. But first things first: the Adelaide is one of eight Northern Territory rivers whose expansive floodplains create a great expanse of coastal wetland – a perfect habitat for all sorts of unique animals and plant life. Including crocodiles. It will be very relaxing – but don't relax too much because any minute you might see the tell-tale ripples signaling an approaching reptile. You'll want to have your camera poised in hopes of capturing that breathtaking moment when the croc breaks the water and vaults out in a shower of spray, scales and muscle. It's a primal, surprising thrill you won't soon forget.

- Travel by coach into tropical wetlands where all sorts of unique animals and plants feel at home.
- Head for the Adelaide River for a cruise along this watercourse known for its jumping crocs.
- Watch the waters as toothy, full-grown adult crocodiles spontaneously leap out of the water by as much as their body length.
- Keep your camera ready to capture this at least once, since otherwise, no one at home will believe you.
- Wear weather-appropriate clothing.
- Flat, comfortable walking shoes with non-slip soles are recommended.
- Bring a hat, insect repellent, sunglasses and sunscreen as needed.

Visiting the Fannie Bay Gaol Museum, you'll see a cruder side of Darwin's heritage. Active from 1883 through 1979, this prison – complete with chilling old gallows section – kept the local peace with a harsh hand. A drive with photo stops at the botanic gardens and scenic East Point rounds out this well-rounded city survey.

- Enjoy a drive through the city with visits to key venues where Darwin's colorful history is the focus.
- Visit Fannie Bay Gaol Museum, housed in Darwin's original – and not inviting – penal institution.
- Tour an eclectic museum where Aboriginal artifacts, Southeast Asian crafts, Oceanic art, and one very large stuffed crocodile are just part of the offerings.
- Learn about the whirlwind visit of Cyclone Tracy in 1974, and the spirited rebuild that followed.
- Stop by the botanic gardens and admire East Point, scenically perched at the harbor's entrance.

Watch the sights glide by, enjoy some refreshment on board, and be on the lookout for naval vessels from all over the world in the waters of this decidedly multicultural city.

Enjoy a jaunt around Cooktown and get an excellent introduction to this frontier town in Queensland's far north. The town's name and early fame are both tied to one pivotal event that took place here in 1770: British explorer and cartographer Captain James Cook's ship Endeavour smashed into the Great Barrier Reef offshore. Limping into what became known as the Endeavour River to beach the vessel and repair the damage, he inadvertently established the first non-indigenous settlement in Australia. At the James Cook Museum, housed in a grand former convent built with 1880s gold rush wealth, see actual relics from the Endeavour, including her anchor and a cannon jettisoned during the grounding. Later, an amble through the Botanic Gardens introduces you to exotic Aussie flora like chocolate pudding trees, jackfruit, blue ginger and the Cooktown Orchid, state emblem of Queensland.

- Enjoy a guided overview of Australia's first non-indigenous settlement, founded temporarily and by accident by Captain James Cook.
- Drive through town and up to the top of Grassy Hill, where Cook saw much the same views you will.
- Visit a museum brimming with artifacts from Cook's ship, from journals to an anchor and cannon.
- Take a relaxed stroll through tropical botanic gardens established in 1878 and see colorful, curious plants long-used for food and medicine by local aboriginal peoples.

Visit two of Cooktown's most iconic sites: one, a mysterious heap of enormous boulders; the other, a pub that's been a fixture in the bush for since 1875. First up is a geological oddity steeped in aboriginal myth – and still giving most visitors the chills. Black Mountain is an enormous labyrinthine jumble of granite, some as large as a house, randomly stacked on each other as if defying gravity. Over millions of years, the soil that was once between them has eroded away, creating a warren of narrow gaps and passageways that lead deep inside the "mountain." Needless to say, this has led to many accounts of people and even entire herds of cattle disappearing inside this maze without a trace. Even just gazing out on this place is haunting. Your next stop will be a haunt of a different sort – a legendary watering hole in the bush that's been serving offbeat frontier characters their afternoon "coldies" for well over a century. Many have left a record of their visit scrawled on the Lion's Den Pub's walls, doors – even its roof. You'll be served a cool drink of your own here, and a deep draft of atmosphere.

- Visit Black Mountain's pile of huge granite boulders riddled with maze-like passageways and imagine how people and cattle could get lost and vanish inside.

- Hear about the cyclone and floods which almost swept away the pub in December 2024 and how remote communities came together to rebuild the iconic pub

As you cruise the river and harbor, you'll learn more about the area, including its history of pearling and the rapid wealth that came after gold was discovered nearby in 1872.
